Dormitory fee (International House, Off-campus dormitory) Monthly rent: 19,000 yen
One-time payment : 15,000 yen
(The amount is subject to change.)

Living costs It costs around 80,000 yen per month for meals, electricity, phone bills and dormitory. Students will also need to pay for textbooks, leisure and other activities. It may be different depending on individual's lifestyle.

Insurance 1. National Health Insurance (about 20,000 yen/year)
2. Accident Insurance policies (about 1,500 yen/year)
are compulsory. The amount is subject to change.
